C I enforce the importance for Bangor to be a book town." Independent bookseller Gibran Graham, owner of The Briar Patch Bookstore and Coe Space in Bangor, testified at Thursday's breakfast meeting that the city has a huge book culture.

Mr. Graham came to Bangor thirty years ago, and he demonstrates his enthusiasm for the city by serving on the City Council and promotes the many opportunities for



learning and recreation.

That combination is available on November 17 at the Bangor Public Library when the quarterly meeting of Pecha Kucha happens. The evening's format allows 6-8 presentations, each lasting no longer than six minutes and 40 seconds. Mr. Graham said the event seeks presentations ("you can talk about anything," but it has to fall within the time limit). The website, pechakucha.org, will (quickly) tell you more about this international organization.

Mr. Graham reminded us of the Bangor Book Festival scheduled for this Saturday at the Bangor Public Library. On Friday night, the Gracie Theater at Husson University will host a showing of the film "I Know a Man," about the artistry and life of Ashley Bryan, a longtime resident of Little Cranberry Island.
