Not quite. Tracy Willette, Director of the Bangor Parks and Recreation Department, described his enthusiasm at Thursday's meeting for the programs, staff and participants in the city's recreation offerings. **Dave Merritt** introduced Mr. Willette with his mantra, "Take a break and recreate."

His position does sound like a lot of fun. But the work involved - supervising a staff of twelve and about 100 volunteers, depending on the season; managing hiking trails; City Forest; pools; the Municipal Golf Course; Sawyer Arena; the waterfront- including the harbormaster - and a vigorous after-school program, leaves Mr. Willette, who joined the department in 1999, little time for play.

The rewards for people having fun in the city's recreational facilities provide him with satisfaction.

He spoke of improvements, including placement of 26 signs in City Forest to reduce phone calls like, "I am lost in the City Forest! Where am I?" Sections of the bog boardwalk are being replaced, and the Community Garden on Essex Street has grown from twenty beds in 2011 to 150 beds now. There is room for 50 more. To maintain a bed costs gardeners \$25 per season.

Working in the meeting



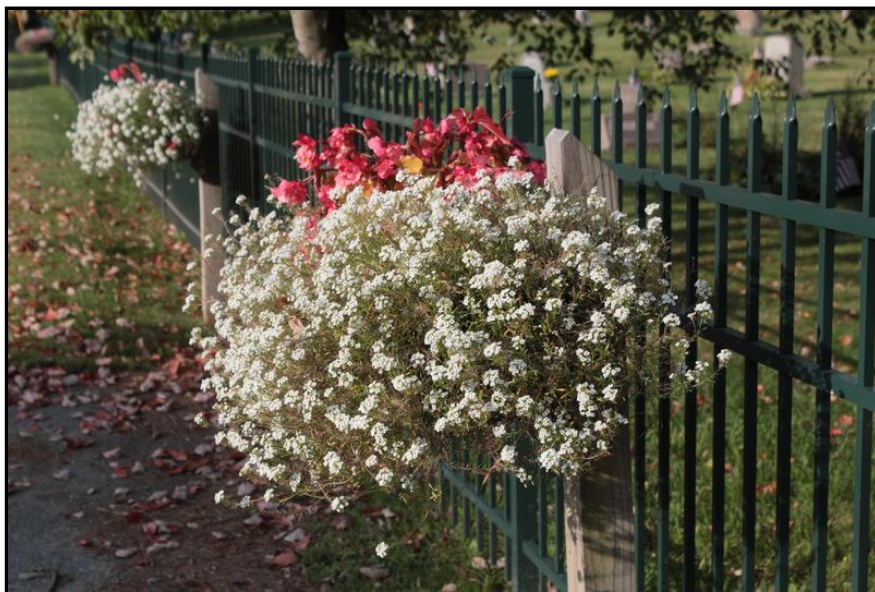

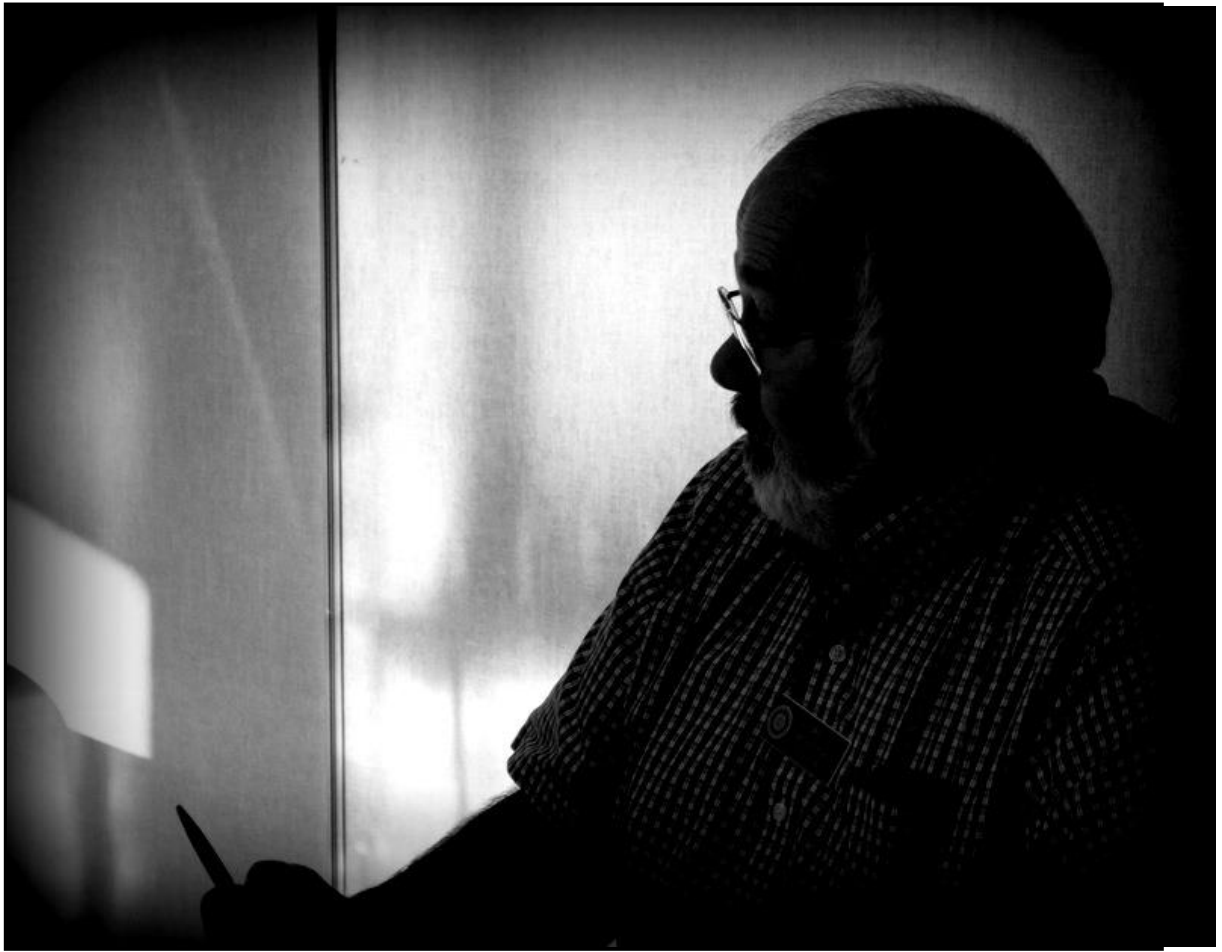
