his is Sherri Phinney's mantra. Ms. Phinney is the Account Manager for Donor Recruitment for the American Red Cross. Introduced by colleague **Caroline King**, Ms. Phinney emphasized the value of donating blood and how much is needed.

The Red Cross responds to disasters, surgeries and a host of other situations requiring blood. Blood drives are often successful, and Ms. Phinney cited the



Shriners, the Amish community in the Unity area, and high schools for their work in attracting donors. **Karen Schaller** said she is a regular blood donor. "It takes about an hour," she said, but she recommends making an appointment at the site to avoid undue waiting.

The shelf life of donated blood - 47 days - compared to the frequency with which an individual can give blood - 66 days - means that donor recruitment is critical to meeting the daily goal of 300 pints.

"New England, including Maine, is the largest exporter of blood to the rest of the nation," Ms. Phinney said.
